Problem Statement by ANNETTE KIVUMBI on case Steven Van Dyke



SVD, a 36-year-old Caucasian male smoker presents to the ED ensuing an acute onset of non-radiating, nonreproducible chest tightness of >20 minutes duration, symptoms beginning while he was watching TV. He complains of associated palpitations, shortness of breath, choking sensation, dizziness, nausea, sweating, and “fear of having a heart attack.” The client asserts that one month ago he experienced similar episodes lasting 5-20 minutes, and increasing in intensity over the past week. The first episode happened while exercising; subsequent episodes occurred during work-related meetings. However, this last episode happened while he was at rest watching tv. SVD has a significant PMH for childhood asthma. He denies any history of psychiatric disorders. The patient’s father succumbed to a massive heart attack at the age of 62. This happened 2 years ago. Physical exam indicates an anxious-appearing young male with fidgety hands and legs. He has tachycardia and takes deep breaths between speaking in phrases. The cardiopulmonary and neurologic exams are otherwise normal.

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Management Plan by ANNETTE KIVUMBI on case Steven Van Dyke



Follow up on lab tests.

Begin zoloft 100mg once daily and valium 5mg po TID prn.

Consult a psychiatric.

psychoeducation and encourage the patient on lifestyle modification to alleviate anxiety.

Encourage the patient on smoking cessation techniques

Provide psychotherapy, specifically CBT and relaxation techniques
